Park Reports

Rotary

- Flags that are marked for gas pipes for two major gas transition pipes for awareness in the event of construction (ex: pavilion).
- Track looks fantastic
- Dead overlook over the electric box at tennis courts needs to be replanted

Municipal

Charles Brigode was present to provide an update on Summer Recreation.

- Clean bathrooms
- Carpet in the activity would be a fantastic addition and would need to be discussed with Charles Brigode. Linoleum carpet squares would be good for cleanups.
- An expression swing could be a neat idea as the parent(s) and child are able to play together
- The vandalism on the hot water heater is now being monitored by two cameras in the northeast and southwest corners.
- The ruts need to be filled
- The pickleball courts are officially done!

Davis

- Looks spectacular and is being kept clean

Woodlands

- There is asphalt damage in the parking area with much traffic
- Play equipment steps paint is peeling and rusting, yet replacement parts will take care of it
- The mowing job by the wooden shelter is not good enough
- The signpost by the bike rack and pavilion is on the ground
- The bike rack rail is turned around, yet can be fixed if the bolts are straightened
- A couple of brush piles are present and in need of being picked up
- There is a dead tree laying on the ground on the Eastside

Rivercrest

- The ash trees are being treated
- The parking lot needs attention
- The spring toy is in constant repair, so it should be questioned as to if it should stay

Orleans

- There is graffiti on the bridge and fence,
- One canoe rack was removed due to damage

Three Meadows

- There was flooding around the pond in May, yet working now
- The horseshoe pits are gone and the grass there is growing
- Handicap and stroller accessibility is difficult due to the poor roads, trails, and pavements that should be treated. Perhaps there should be handicap accessibility added on the incline by the condos.
- The paint at the south end shelter is peeling

Milestone

- The grass is damaged off Hickory Street

Hood

- Looks sound and stable
- There is a parking problem
- The flag pole needs scraped, repainted, and remounted which will be coming into place after checked by city preservation

Bicentennial

- The baseball bench looks great
- There are a number of ruts from the water
- There's lots of trash
- The new picnic tables look great
- The dog water bowl needs to go
- Doggie bags should be installed

Update from City Council

- There is a potential inclusive park in Rotary that can be created without taxpayer dollars. It will be combined with the splash pad
- Would there be any competition between the pool and the splash pad?
- The study for the splash pad will be open to PRAC
