

**City of Perrysburg
PRAC Minutes
June 7, 2010**

The PRAC committee met at 7:00 pm, June 7, 2010 at the Rivercrest Park. In attendance were Nick Camp, Ron Stewart, Joe Lawless, Mary Siefke, Tom St. Meyers, Brenda Irwin, Todd Grayson, Jacob Fleming, Matt Skotynsky and Tami Wise.

At the May meeting on May 3, there was discussion about the summer recreation program and park updates were provided.

The summer rec program, pool and baseball are all active right now. Soccer is winding down for the summer. Most of the parks are very busy right now.

Park Updates:

Rotary Park – planting of grass should be the next step but probably no until the fall. A 2nd coat of blacktop will be applied if it hasn't been done already. We did not receive grant money for the walking path, so a second grant application is being prepared and submitted. Rotary is in the process of working with other local organizations to secure additional funds.

Bicentennial – the water fountain is in. There is a pile of dirt and concrete near the new water fountain that needs to be removed. Some of the trees need to be trimmed, specifically the tree behind the team bench, near first base. There is some residual trash lying inside the wooden garbage can holder that needs to be cleaned up. There were teams playing baseball recently at the park. Bicentennial was supposed to be for practice only. The support posts of the shelter house need painting.

Three Meadows – there has been quite a bit of activity at the pond. The fishing derby was held recently and was well attended.

Municipal – one of basketball rims was torn down and the hitting board on the tennis court may be leaning. The park has been very active and parking is limited during high times. People have been parking in the grass as the paved lots have been full.

Eisenhower – been very busy.

Rivercrest – there is a broken teeter swing. It was the spring type, one-seater. It has an orange cone placed over the base. The drinking fountains near the shelter house shoot water about 2 feet in the air. The play area needs mulch. There are some low spots and the filter fabric is exposed in some areas. The fences on the baseball diamonds look nice. There have been comments that there is no warning track along the outfield fences. The water fountain attached to the baseball building (near the bathrooms) appears to be leaking.

Hood – everything looks good except there are some significant weeds in the rocks.

Orleans – the road to the fishing area has a number of potholes. The mulch pile was empty recently at the compost site. The canoe racks are full.

Riverside – everything is good except there are some ruts in the road.

The next meeting will be at 7:00pm, July 12 at the Riverside Park.
