

PRAC Meeting Notes 6/6/16 Municipal Park

Each attending committee member reported on his/her park(s).

Ben Rotary Park: Observed a sign post in a tree, possibly in the wrong location.
A dead tree probably needs to be removed.
Greg added that they will soon put up the tennis windscreens.

Brenda Woodland Park: Stone paths are being improved.
Mulch needs to be freshened up.
Greg added new grills were installed at all shelters, added new ash trays.

Jessica Orleans Park: Graffiti under the bridge has been painted over.
The "compost" sign off Green Lane is broken. It needs to be replaced and likely moved to a more prominent location.

Liz Milestone and Hood Parks:
Milestone looks fine.
Hood park has weeds in every bed and a limb down near the upper-level parking lot.
Greg added that the park had recently been weeded, but they would hit it again.

Tom Municipal Park: Looks good.
He is in possession of a tennis net tie down that he found in the grass. He will bring it in.
The glider on the swing set does not work. Greg thought the ball bearings needed to be replace, and he added that to his to-do's.

Aaron Riverside Park: Everything has been removed in preparation for the renovation.
Greg added that two trees on the river level will soon be moved to Roachton Road. There will be an arboretum there, and they may be part of that.
The hillside is not being mowed in anticipation of work getting started.
