

## **Minutes of Perrysburg Public Utilities Committee**

**Meeting Held June 25, 2025**

### **CALL TO ORDER - 4:30 PM**

The meeting was called to order at 4:30 p.m. by Chairman Kevin Fuller.

### **ROLL CALL**

Committee members present were Kevin Fuller, and Rick Rettig. Kerry Wellstein was absent. Staff members present were Matt Choma, Brian Thomas, and Joe Fawcett.

### **CITIZEN'S CONCERNS**

None.

### **APPROVAL OF MAY 28, 2025 MEETING MINUTES**

There being no objections, the minutes of the May 28, 2025 meeting were approved.

### **CHANGE ORDER TO RESOLUTION 128-2024**

Mr. Choma spoke to the committee about needing additional funding for survey and design services for the 2025 Water Main Replacement Project. Mr. Choma said they are requesting a change order for \$3,900. The Committee agreed 2-0 to move this on to City Council.

### **SANITARY SEWER CREDITS**

Mr. Choma distributed a list of sewer credits approved since the last meeting. The credits totaled \$71.10 for the month of April. The year-to-date total for sewer credits was \$6,591.86.

### **OTHER BUSINESS**

Mr. Choma informed the committee that the EPA has concluded its Consumer Confidence Report on the City's drinking water and no contaminants such as lead, high levels of chlorine and organic matter were found. He said the EPA this year also tested the drinking water for "forever chemicals" (PFAS) and they did not find any contaminants. Mr. Rettig asked where the forever chemicals come from. Mr. Choma said clothing treated with flame-resistant chemicals as well as non-stick pans both contain forever chemicals. Mr. Fuller asked if he has noticed a difference in the quality of the drinking water. Mr. Choma said that his department tests the water for organic materials weekly and hasn't noticed a decrease in quality.

Mr. Choma spoke to the committee about the cleaning of an aeration tank for the Wastewater Treatment Plant. He said that this would be a "walk-on" piece of legislation because the bid window closes tomorrow (6/26). Mr. Choma said that this tank is currently down because it needs cleaning, so they would like to get it taken care of as soon as possible. The Committee agreed 2-0 to move this on to City Council.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 4:40 p.m.
